For instance, the design could be decorated with drilled holes, be made of porous materials or consist of a gaps or low gaps for ventilation. The seat back may be designed as an included headrest by way of extending the height over the occupant's head. At times the ottoman can be mounted to a glider chair with swing arms, allowing the ottoman to rock back and forth along with the glider similar to a rocking chair along with a built-in footrest.
